Dead End Road Safety Performance

This week, our Year 11 pupils took part in an engaging and impactful road safety performance and workshop delivered by the Collingwood Team. The session focused on the Fatal Four causes of serious road incidents: distraction, speeding, not wearing seatbelts, and driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Through a powerful combination of drama, discussion, and real-life scenarios, pupils explored the potential dangers associated with risky behaviours on the road—both as future drivers and as passengers.

The performance prompted thoughtful reflection, and the follow-up Q&A session saw pupils participating maturely and enthusiastically, asking insightful questions and demonstrating a clear understanding of the importance of responsible decisions.

Overall, it was a highly successful workshop that reinforced essential safety messages encouraged our pupils to think carefully about their actions and responsibilities on the road.

Year 13 Business Studies Grade Booster

Year 13 BTEC Business students spent the day at the tutor2u Unit 2 Grade Booster workshop in Shepherd's Bush, and it proved to be a productive use of time. The sessions were fast-moving, focused on exam requirements, and built around the demands of the "Developing a Marketing Campaign" unit.

Students were provided with a detailed booklet and access to an online resource hub containing exam-style, tasks, model responses and guidance on how to meet assessment criteria. Its practical material designed to support revision rather than just recap content.

The group were switched on throughout. They asked questions, contributed ideas, and engaged with the case studies rather than sitting in silence. Some students picked up prizes for strong contributions, which helped keep the atmosphere competitive and upbeat.

With the January exam approaching, the workshop landed at the right time. Overall, it gave students a clear boost to their preparation. The real test comes in this week's PPE, where they'll get a chance to apply what they picked up in a timed environment. If they follow it up with focused practice afterwards, it should translate into stronger performance when the real exam arrives in January.
