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On **25 June 2025**, 26 Year 12 students with a keen interest in finance, had the incredible opportunity to visit the **Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA)**. The visit, led by **Alex FrappelI**, offered valuable insights into the world of accounting and finance.

The students were warmly welcomed by their host, **George Tsounias**, who guided them through a packed and informative day. Throughout the visit, students explored the various pathways to becoming ACCA-qualified and delved into the importance of **transferable skills** such as communication, proactivity, relationship-building, teamwork, and resilience.

George also walked the students through the different stages of the apprenticeship application process, including online tests, interviews (both video and face-to-face), and assessment centres. As part of their learning, they participated in activities to help them prepare for interviews using the **STAR model** (Situation, Task, Action, Result) to articulate their transferable skills. They also picked up useful tips on presenting themselves professionally, including techniques like the **Superhero pose** to boost confidence.

Last week Year 12 students were given the opportunity to take a 4-day trip to south Devon. The students stayed at Slapton Ley, an hour from Plymouth city centre and fifteen minutes from the beach. The trip's purpose was to help prepare Year 12 for the Geography NEA coursework, which they have now started and will continue into Year 13.

During the stay. the FSC instructors were able to provide students with informative resources, lessons on calculating statistical data, as well as data collection methods to help prepare for the day in the city. Students spent the first day in Plymouth city centre, looking at the quality of different areas based on their level of regeneration. The second day was spent at the coast, collecting samples of rocks and types of coastal defences, as well as collecting research from residents in the area. On the third day, the students had a successful but long day independently collecting data for their project. They began by making their way into the city centre and splitting off into smaller groups, using the day to collect clone

town surveys, EQS, population counts, epitome surveys, as well as bipolar surveys. It was a knowledgeable and teamwork building experience. Students enjoyed their time, filled with laughter and many funny moments, as well as a few learning curves for many pupils (the importance of sun cream being a big one).
