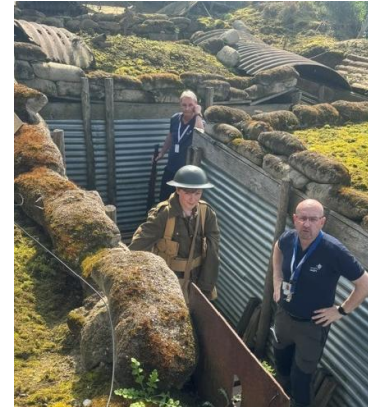


## ★ Year 9 Visit to Ypres
