#### Year 13 Trip to Hampton Court Palace

On Wednesday, our Year 13 Historians enjoyed an immersive visit to Hampton Court Palace. Pupils took part in a bespoke AQA workshop focusing on the Mid Tudor Crisis, examining the reigns of Henry VIII, Edward VI, Mary I, and Elizabeth I.

Using the Palace itself as a historical source, alongside contemporary primary materials, pupils investigated the political and social turbulence of the period. Highlights included a dramatic reenactment of the power struggle between Northampton and Somerset over young Edward VIwhich, in a surprising twist, even involved Edward's dog!

Thanks to exclusive access during a Schools' Only Day, pupils explored the magnificent, empty Great Hall, bringing the events they have been studying in the classroom vividly to life. This hands-on experience will support their understanding and help them form informed judgments on the Mid Tudor Crisis as they prepare for their A Level exams next summer.


