Not only did we secure the year group trophies across both boys' and girls' categories, but we also proudly brought home the shields for OVERALL GIRLS, OVERALL BOYS, and the coveted **OVERALL OVERALL** title!

In addition to our brilliant team results, there were countless individual medal winners. Of particular note, four district records were broken, all by St Martin's athletes, which is an extraordinary achievement! Congratulations to:

- **Jess (Year 8G)** 300m in 44.4 seconds
- **Erin (Year 9G)** 1500m in 5:10.3
- Emmie (Year 10G) 800m in 2:19.7
- **Jamal (Year 10B)** 300m in 37.0

District records have been recorded for over 30 years, so they are a real part of the Brentwood District Athletics history.

A special mention goes to Amelie (Year 10), who demonstrated true St Martin's spirit by competing in both the 1500m and triple jump, despite having a British Qualifying event later that same evening. Amelie won Brentwood District Gold with ease and, while she could have comfortably broken the record, she chose to conserve energy for her evening race. We are confident that great things lie ahead for her!

To conclude our celebrations, Year 10s, Marvellous and Joseph won the Lewis Fraser Memorial Cup for the highest podium places out of all the performers in the championships. Both boys won 2 gold and one silver. Andie, in Year 10 also won 2 gold and one silver but was just pipped to the girls' award by a triple gold medallist from Ursuline.



EMOTIONAL WELLBEING

The NSPCC have partnered with Ambitious about Autism to bring online safety tips, advice and activities specifically for parents and carers of children with SEND. Letting your child go online can be intimidating; you might worry about the different spaces they explore, the people they meet digitally and the potential for things going wrong.

Being online can be positive for children and young people, including those with additional needs. So much of our communication now happens online, either by messages, in a game or through a video call. Sometimes online platforms like the apps, social media sites and games your child accesses can help them connect and make friends with new people that they might not know offline.

As a parent or carer, you play an important role in helping your child to have positive experiences online. If your child has additional needs, then this role can be even more important, and it can feel like a lot of responsibility when you hear about some of the risks young people face online.

Attendance and Taking Holidays during term time.

Every child is entitled to a full-time education and so schools are directed by the Government and Local Authority on how to manage their attendance. Our school policy is based on those guidelines and this is the procedure that we follow. For every day that your child is absent, you must inform the school and provide a reason for that absence. In order for that absence to be coded properly, you must provide the exact reason, i.e 'unwell' or 'sick' will not be accepted. For our attendance policy, please see here:

We have as a school received a large number of requests for absence during the school term. A majority of these have not been accepted as they do not meet the criteria for exceptional circumstances and parents have been prosecuted. Please do not take your child out of school for a family holiday. Whilst we appreciate that there may be cost implications for you, we refer all such cases to the local authority who have been issuing fixed penalty fines. The fines are £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days. This escalates to £160 if paid before 28 days.
