## Year 9 Girls STEM Event

On Monday the Year 9 female pupils participated in a 'Girls into STEM' event. The event featured visiting engineers from AtkinsRéalis, who provided insights into the field of engineering. Pupils engaged in team-building exercises that fostered collaboration and creativity.

One highlight was a bridge-building challenge, where pupils applied triangulation techniques to design and construct models. Within just one hour, they also produced innovative prototype concepts for sustainable roadside features on the Thames Gateway crossing.



The engineers were impressed by the girls' problem-solving skills and creativity, noting the valuable knowledge and experience gained during the event. This initiative not only encouraged interest in STEM careers but also empowered pupils to envision their future in engineering. Finding out what opportunities are on offer within Design and Technology at KS4 and 5 will help pupils make informed choices about their future career journey. 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



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# Royal Institute Watercolour Competition
