Start of the school day

- Once you cross the RED line all pupils must be wearing full school uniform.
- Skirts must not be rolled, trainers must not be worn and mobile phones must not be used anywhere on school site.
- Continue to line up in your year group zones in alphabetical order and in silence.
- Move safely, calmy and responsibly to your form room



End of the school day

- Once the RED line has been crossed you can access your mobile phone.
- You must be in full school uniform as ambassadors of St Martin's.



Culture for Learning

- Clear non-negotiables within our classrooms
- These apply to Everyone. Every lesson. Every day.



Culture for Learning – Non negotiables

- 1. Be **on time** to lesson
- 2. Greet at the door with a warm welcome
- 3. Be smart and quiet on entry
- 4. Be prepared to learn; behind chair, equipment out
- 5. Follow instructions; we will help you learn by using "Reminder, Warning and Sanction"
- 6. Be respectful to others
- 7. Be empathetic to others Listen and respond appropriately

Rewards

- Achievement postcards sent home by each department
- Sporting achievements celebrated at the end of the academic year through the Sports Presentation Evening
- Department rewards certificates each half term to celebrate progress, effort and achievement which are presented in assembly
- Leaders badges
- Honours Awards which take place at the end of the academic year
- Attendance awards
- Headteachers Award
- Rewards trips at the end of every term



Sanctions

- Sanctions will vary depending on the severity of the action and situation
- Minus Points have been introduced
- Satchel One download the FREE App!



Reminder — Warning — Sanction

- 1st Infringement REMINDER You will be reminded of the rule
- 2nd Infringement WARNING You will be warned about your behaviour for one last time
- 3rd Infringement SANCTION –A sanction will be issued



Mobile phone confiscation

- First offence phone returned at the end of the school day
- Second offence pupils remains back after school for 10 mins and phone returned
- Third offence phone confiscated and held overnight
- Fourth offence phone held until the end of the week and then returned. Phone must be handed into DHOY at the start of every day once phone has been returned going forwards



De-Classing

- Continuous rule breaking in class despite Reminder Warning -Sanction (parent/carers must be called/emailed to share concerns by class teacher or Subject Lead if required)
- Refusing to follow instructions inside the classroom
- Walking away from the classroom
- Swearing at another pupil/teacher in class
- Racism, bullying, misogyny or homophobia inside the classroom or around the school site

Any of these behaviours may result in an isolation/exclusion once investigated



Detentions

- Break time 10 minutes
- Lunch time 20 minutes
- After school 1 hour
- After school 2 hours

If a detention is set you must attend – these are non-negotiable. Not attending a detention will lead to escalation.

Drugs

- All non-medical drugs on school premises are unacceptable
- St Martin's will educate its pupils about the dangers of drugs through PSHEE, Science, assemblies, school nurse, visiting groups, guest speakers
- Vaping and vapes is not allowed on the school premises or as a member of the school community

Why a Behaviour Culture is important for your learning



<u>DfE National Behaviour Survey</u> (first to take place)

- •62% of school leaders and teachers reported that misbehaviour interrupted teaching
- •67% of pupils reported that misbehaviour had interrupted their work in at least some lessons.
- •Teachers reported that for every 30 minutes of lesson time, 6.3 minutes were lost due to misbehaviour.
