The League of Nations

- Formed 28th June 1919 44 countries signed a Covenant - aim of maintaining world peace
- Promised to accept League decisions, disarm and protect each other - Collective Security
 - Disputes between members solved through League



- Council Small group of major members met several times a year and settled disputes - unanimous decisions Assembly Parliament with one representative from every country - met once a year, gave ideas to Council
- Secretariat 📥 Carried out Council decisions
- Permanent Court of Peacefully resolved international disputes Justice
- International Labour Content and worker representatives improved Organisation working conditions
- Special Commissions Coups to tackle social issues, e.g. health, refugees

Kellog-Briand Pact 1928

- Signed by 60 countries
- Agreed war should only be in defence rather than 'national policy'
- Germany signed seen as accepted member of international community

Locarno Treaties 1925

France, Germany, UK and Italy agreed peace
Germany agreed to keep troops out of Rhineland

2.THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS AND INTERNATIONAL PEACE

<u>Membership</u> US never joined - isolationist WW1 losers not initially allowed USSR joined in 1934 UK, France, Italy and Japan Council members

The Abyssinian Crisis

- 3rd Oct 1935 Mussolini invaded Abyssinia
- Britain and France wanted Italy as ally against Germany so refused to intervene
- League refused to trade rubber, iron and arms with Italy but this was ineffective
- May 1936 Abyssinia declared Italian colony
- Destroyed League's remaining credibility could not prevent war in 1939

Contribution to peace in 1920s

- League decided Aaland Islands should remain part of Finland rather than Sweden
- Divided Upper Silesia between Germany and Poland
- League ordered Mussolini to leave Corfuthough he undermined them and forced Greece to pay him compensation for murdered Italian General
- League stopped fighting between Bulgaria and Greece
- League did nothing to stop Poland invading Vilna

The Manchurian Crisis

- Feb 1933 League of Nations voted that Japan should abandon its invasion of Manchuria
- Japan ignored the League invaded part of China then launched full invasion in 1937
- League couldn't enforce sanctions against Japan as US continued trading with them and Britain and France feared backlash from their colonies
- League seen as weak Hitler and Mussolini
 emboldened



- The Depression
- Caused by Wall Street Crash Oct 1929
- US government had to recall European loans - caused international Great Depression
- Rise in unemployment and hunger allowed rise in extremism, e.g. Nazis
- League couldn't afford to use economic sanctions or start wars against fascist dictators
