Freya helps Lionesses qualify in European Championships

Freya Godfrey in Year 12 was selected to represent the England Women's U17 Squad at a UEFA International Fixture Camp this week. The squad spent 3 days in London on a pretraining camp prior to flying to Bydgoszcz, Poland. The girls then played 3 games in total as part of the European Women's Under17 Championship qualifying round. The first match was against Russia which ended in a 2-0 loss. Freya came on as a second half substitute in this game and played the final 30 minutes. The second game was against Belgium which ended in a 1-0 win for England and Freya was named in the starting 11 for this game. The final game was against the hosts of the tournament Poland and England lost this final game 2-0. Freya was again named in the starting 11 and played the full 90 minutes. The 3 points that England secured throughout the tournament ensures qualification for the second qualifying round. The Player Education Officer for the Lionesses said "Freya should be very proud of the contributions she made both on and off the pitch throughout this event". Well done Freya, you are a wonderful role model for our younger students!
