
Autistic FC

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Year 9 Curriculum Evening

Last Wednesday saw a very well attended Year 9 Curriculum Evening; the atmosphere was buzzing with information sharing as both Year 9 students and parents sourced information from curriculum leaders and subject teachers to help them choose their options as they move from Key Stage 3 into Key Stage 4. The evening was split into two parts.


A talk was given by the Deputy Headteacher (Curriculum and Assessment) and the Director of Key Stage 3 outlining the options process and why the pathways provided for the students are as they are. This was followed by an opportunity for parents to speak with the curriculum and pastoral team regarding their child's choices.

This was followed up by a face to face meeting with members of the faculty leadership teams. Parents and students could speak to subject leaders about their subjects at GCSE. This was especially important for subjects which are new to students at Key Stage 4 such as Media Studies, Computer Science, Business Studies, Sociology and Health and Social Care. The feedback from parents/carers at the evening was very positive; they found the support being given at this important time in their child's life very helpful.
