Rainbow Flag Award

As we celebrate Pride in June, there is no better time to inform you all that St Martin's has now achieved the Rainbow Flag Award!

The Rainbow Flag Award is a national quality assurance framework for primary schools, secondary schools, SEND schools and colleges. The award focuses on positive LGBT+, (lesbian, gay, bisexual, trans, plus other related identities), inclusion and visibility. The Rainbow Flag Award encourages a whole organisation approach to LGBT+ inclusion, as well as developing strategies to effectively challenge and combat LGBTphobic bullying.



As part of the award, we have made many changes and adjustments to our school, such as making sure staff know what terminology to use, promoting inclusivity throughout the curriculum and throughout LGBTQ+ PRISM club, adding a parents' information section on the school website signposting and giving supportive advice and information if needed as well as involving student voice in ways to embrace the diverse communities we have.

This week, Year 12 have listened to an assembly by Mr Shoker encouraging them to remember that Representation Matters, and this has also been shared with the rest of the year groups. At lunchtime on Thursday 16 June, there will be a cake sale in N016, with all profits being donated to an LGBTQ charity of PRISM group's choice. There will be lots of other opportunities for Pride to be celebrated this month and in the future any student wishing to join PRISM is welcome to come to N016 on a Thursday lunchtime.
