## **Year 12 Devised Drama Performance**

At the end of June, the Year 12 Drama and Theatre A level cohort performed their Component 1 devised pieces to an audience of Year 10 Drama students and Year 9 students who have chosen Drama as a GCSE option for September.

Year 12 students were given the task of devising an original performance using an extract from a play text as a stimulus. They also had to embed the methodologies of Kneehigh Theatre Company within their performance. This included storytelling, song and puppetry. Final pieces explored a variety of untold stories about mental health, feminism, luck, refugees and loneliness.

Students produced work of an incredibly high quality and as a result, have successfully completed 40% of their A level course.
