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## Hollywood 2023

During the Easter Holidays the Drama and Music departments took 61 Year 9 and 10 students to Hollywood, Los Angeles for a life-changing and fun-filled, jam-packed week of activities.

Following a very long flight, our first full day was spent in beautiful Santa Monica. Students spent an hour cycling along the stunning Venice Beach and spent time on Santa Monica Pier. Dinner that evening was at the famous Bubba Gump's restaurant, with some of the students and staff winning prizes for their knowledge of the movie, Forrest Gump!

We travelled to two local theatres in LA during our time there, to take part in workshops led by professional actors and musicians working in Hollywood. Students were instructed on the techniques of improvisation, building characters and narrative. In both workshops, we had the opportunity to ask the instructors questions, and gained some insights into working in the Performing Arts industry in Hollywood.

Another highlight was our walking tour of Hollywood, we trod the Hollywood Walk of Fame - spotting celebrity stars, 'walked the red carpet' up to the Dolby Theatre – home of the Oscars, visited Grauman's Chinese Theatre with the cement-preserved hand and foot-prints and learnt about the history of Hollywood Boulevard from our tour guide. We also took a trip to Beverly Hills and walked the length of the iconic Rodeo Drive with its designer outlets and high-end fashion.

In stark contrast, the following day, we had an unforgettable experience at Union Rescue Mission. The Mission are one of LA's homeless charities in Skid Row and serve over 3000 meals a day to the homeless community. After six weeks of rehearsals at school, our students performed a Beatles medley at the Mission, during their food service to the many families under their care. The experience was incredibly moving with the poignancy of the lyrics not lost on the students or staff as we sang. I Want to Hold Your Hand, Imagine and Hey Jude were followed by Ella Abberley in Year 9 singing Let it Be. The families and Mission staff thoroughly enjoyed the performance and were very grateful that we had given so freely of our time to support the Mission.

A highlight for many students was spending a day at the world-famous Universal Studios Hollywood where we had time to explore the park, including Harry Potter World and the brand new Mario Land. The weather was perfect for going on rides and taking the Universal Studios Tram Tour ride which took us through the back lot of the adjacent studios.

On our final day, we toured Warner Bros Studio which took us through a variety of film sets including the streets used in movies such as Annie and Spiderman. We saw the inside of a soundstage and visited their exhibition which included memorabilia from the TV series Friends, The Big Bang Theory, Harry Potter, DC Superheroes and Game of Thrones.

During the trip, students were able to earn their very own Hollywood Star for their actions on the trip. Our winning stars were awarded for demonstrating maturity, empathy, resilience and versatility at various stages of the trip. Our final award was an Oscar, presented to Keith Jellis. Keith fully embraced every part of the trip from his resilience in workshops, empathy during the Mission performance, to his maturity and positive attitude during the sightseeing tours.

The trip was truly unforgettable, from the friendships forged to the amazing memories created.
