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Lower School Production

Last week, after a very long wait, we were finally able to put on our lower school production of Legally Blonde Jr. After originally starting preparations in March 2020 where we auditioned, cast the show and held just one after school rehearsal, our efforts were halted by the national lockdown. Finally, after a cast change due to some of our original cast now being in Year 10 and 11, months of rehearsals and a lot of hard work, we were finally able to showcase a sensational production.

The show, which has been a West End hit and is currently being shown in the Regent's Park Open Air Theatre, has been bought to life by over 60 of our talented students and has been a joy to work on over the past few months. Students performed four shows, two matinées to our local Primary Schools and two evenings to appreciative audiences of family and friends. The primary school students who came to watch loved the fun and energetic characters and the upbeat and catchy songs, so much so that one primary school emailed to say that their students spent the afternoon singing the songs to their teacher! In the evenings, the hall was packed for both shows where the students took to the stage and really showcased just how much talent we have at St Martin's.

We are so inundated with talent here that I was able to double cast many of our roles. One cast was students in Years 8 and 9, and somehow, we were able to have another cast of entirely Year 7 students, a talented year group indeed! It is impossible to name everyone as we had such a large cast but some of the anchors of the show included our lead Elle Woods (Hannah Northcott and Annie Savill), Paulette (Sienna Shipton and April Wilks), Brooke (Leah McGeoch and Amy Hines) and Vivienne (Corrinne Isaacs and Alexa Camilleri) who performed with outstanding professionalism and commitment. Leonardo Canoro Theodore captured Emmett's ambition and support of Elle perfectly whilst Ethan Perry showcased the selfish ex-boyfriend with comedic timing and excellent vocals. Nicholas Morris highlighted the ruthless nature of Professor Callahan with maturity and conviction. All of the students highlighted above are exceptional talents and will be future stars of St Martin's productions for years to come.

I must thank the staff and production team who have supported the process of putting on this show including Musical Director Mr Harris, Stage Manager Miss Smith, Technical Manager Mr Scates and the rest of the Drama and Music Departments and student helpers. A further special mention must go to Year 12 student Darcy Pilgrim who choreographed the production to such a high quality that I had to keep reminding myself that these students were aged between 11 and 14. Once again, we are also extremely grateful to Year 10 student Jack Liddicott, whose lighting design mirrored the very best that the West End has to offer. We are so lucky to have students who are willing to give up their time to support younger students and act as role models to them. All that is left to say is thank you to everyone who has supported the production and we are already looking forward to next year's talent filled productions!
