


Headteacher's Comment

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KS3 Geography Club

Last term the geography club were hard at work constructing their very own volcano!

Students heard about the La Palma volcanic eruption and decided they wanted to learn more. They researched some of the world's most explosive volcanoes to gather more inspiration before planning how they would recreate their very own tectonic event.

Students spent two weeks constructing the rock structure using discarded plastic from around the school, paper-mâché and scrunched up newspaper. They then painted the structure black to represent the solid volcanic rock covering the steep slopes of their volcano. On the final week of construction students mixed together baking soda, washing up liquid, white vinegar and food colouring to create a series of eruptions which caused many lava flows to ooze out of the top and down the sides of their volcanic creation!

The geography club is run by Miss Smith and Mrs Cocklin in N012 every Thursday lunchtime.











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
