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

Context- The Local Area

Although the school's immediate neighbourhood (Local Super Output Area) is ranked 32,350 out of 32,844 areas for Income Deprivation Affecting Children, making this one of the most affluent areas in the country, there are significant pockets of deprivation within the area. An example of this is the CM13 2B postcode areas which falls in the 4th deprived decile. A proportion of students travel in from Harold Hill, Basildon and Laindon where deciles of deprivation are as high as 20% and 10% of the UKs most deprived neighbourhoods.

Teaching priorities for current academic year for all year groups

Measure	Activity
Priority 1- Covid "recovery".	
Priority 2- to identify gaps in learning when students are in school and address these areas in both timetabled lessons and extra support outside lessons.	Teachers regularly mark and assess student progress to identify any areas of weakness/gaps in learning.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	There has been a great inconsistency of students in isolation at different times throughout the school year- therefore this allows students to be able to access learning regardless of their situation/location.
Projected spending	£15,000 for access to laptops for home use; dongles for home use and teachers to be used for extra1-2-1 tuition outside of timetabled lessons both in school and remotely where appropriate.

Targeted academic support for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1- extra support for online learning both in school and remotely in addition to usual timetabled lessons.	Mymaths and Lexia PowerUp can be accessed remotely or in school for extra support and close gaps.
Priority 2- literacy teacher to offer timetabled lessons both in school and remotely during lockdown.	A literacy teacher has been employed to teach small groups of students throughout the school

	day- in addition to the support they already receive in lessons.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Key groups of disadvantaged students are identified to ensure they don't fall further behind. Both the online programmes and in school literacy sessions are catered to individual need and address the personal gaps of each individual.
Projected spending	£50,000 for access to online Lexia PowerUp and Mymaths; a class set of tablets to be used in school in literacy and numeracy catch up lessons and a part-time teacher to run extra support sessions for disadvantaged students in timetabled lessons during the school day.

Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1- school equipment, revision guides and uniform	Revision guides/workbooks and class materials such as calculators/stationery and books (both in class and extra-curricular reading) Students also have access to an online uniform request form to order uniform throughout the academic year where needed.
Priority 2- supporting extra-curricular activities such as learning a musical instrument and sporting activities.	Music lessons are offered to all our disadvantaged students with around 20% making use of this opportunity. Any equipment/kit needed for sporting activities are also provided for our disadvantaged students where needed.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	These extra-curricular activities promote positive mental health and allow students to remain focused for learning. They also build confidence and improve organisational skills.
Projected spending	£15,000 for music lessons for the year, school uniform, Book Buzz, Letterbox Club and stationery, calculators, etc.

Teaching	Inconsistency of students in and out of school during COVID-19 pandemic.	All teachers trained on using Teams to allow lessons to continue in school or remotely. Self isolation folders have been set up to allow students to access the work.
Targeted support	Getting students engaged in extra literacy and numeracy lessons.	New literacy and numeracy programmes have been purchased to engage students in their learning. Literacy and numeracy teachers to create

		interesting and engaging resources.
Wider strategies	Ensuring families know where to apply to extra help and are engaging in extra-curricular activities being offered.	Letters sent home to parents informing them of what is available and how to apply. A request form is also available on the website.
