Application for Bursary

Students aged 19 or over are eligible to receive a discretionary bursary if they:

- Are continuing on a study programme they began aged 16 to 18 (19+ continuers, or
- Have an education, health, and care (EHC) plan

These groups of aged 19+ students can receive a discretionary bursary while they continue to attend education (in the case of a 19+ continuer, this must be the same programme they started before they turned 19), as long as their eligibility continues, and the need remains for support to continue their participation. Students aged 19 or over are not eligible for bursaries for vulnerable

groups.

GUIDANCE NOTES

What is the 16 to 19 school bursary scheme?

16 to 19 bursary schemes were introduced to provide financial help to young people aged 16 to 19 who face financial barriers to participating in education or training, provided they meet agreed standards of attendance and behaviour.

Who is eligible for the bursary scheme?

St. Martin's Sixth Form offers two types of bursary. You can only apply for one type, depending on your personal circumstances.

The vulnerable bursary

To be eligible for the vulnerable bursary you must meet **all four** of the following conditions:

- 1. be starting Year 12 or 13 in September 2024
- 2. be aged between 16 and 18 on 31 August 2024
- 3. belong to one of the following groups and have identifiable financial needs:
 - young person in care, including unaccompanied asylum seeking child
 - young care leaver; or
 - be receiving income support or universal credit in own right; or
 - be receiving Employment Support Allowance and are also in receipt of Disability Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payments
- 4. must meet the residency criteria in ESFA funding regulations

The discretionary bursary

To be eligible for the discretionary bursary you must meet **all four** of the following conditions:

- 1. be starting Year 12 or 13 in September 2024
- 2. be aged between 16 and 18 on 31 August 2024
- 3. living in a household with an annual income below £35,000 before tax and national insurance or, received free school meals in year 11 and would be eligible now, and have identifiable financial needs
- 4. must meet the residency criteria in ESFA funding regulations

Financial support is dependent on supplying requested evidence of income, meeting agreed attendance and behaviour criteria and is at the discretion the Bursary Panel. This is comprised of a Senior Leader, Business Manager and Head of Sixth Form.

How much money will I get?

If you are eligible for the vulnerable bursary you will be entitled to up to £1,200 which will be held by your academy and released to you for specific educational reasons. An agreed monthly amount may be paid into your bank account for travel or other relevant regular expenses.

If you are eligible for the discretionary bursary you will not be allocated a specific amount but your needs will be discussed with the Head of Sixth Form. This money will be used to support your educational studies. Students should not presume that funds will be released and must always ensure the 'costs' will be agreed before any payment is made.

Receipts must be provided for purchases before payment can be made.

What can I use the bursary for?

The bursary is to help with costs related to your studies, for example transport, books and equipment, educational visits and other costs associated with your course. The bursary can also be used for transport costs associated with up to 3 university interviews and open days; preapproval must be sought.

The awards will be dependent on good behaviour, adherence to the sixth form code of conduct and 93% attendance. Please note that the school has been allocated only a small amount for this Bursary Scheme and therefore funds are limited.

Are there any conditions attached to the scheme?

You will be expected to:

- have a good attendance. You will not be eligible for the bursary if your attendance falls below the minimum requirements. Payments will not be backdated.
- be punctual to the academy every day
- attend all lessons
- meet academic targets and
- adhere to the expectations placed on all Sixth Form students.

How do I apply?

- 1. Complete the attached application form and contract.
- 2. Attach evidence of your financial or living situation to support your application. Photocopies are accepted, but if original documents are sent please provide a SAE.
- 3. Give the application to the Finance Office.

When do I need to apply by and how will I hear the outcome?

The deadline for applying is 4 October 2024; please retain any public transport travel receipts/evidence in the meantime. All applications will be considered by the Bursary Panel. We will consider late applications but will consider these after we have processed all the applications received on time. It is unlikely that late applicants will get your payments at the same time as everyone who applied on time.

We will write to everyone who applies to tell you the outcome of your application.

We will also contact you if we need more information from you to process your application.

If household circumstances change during the academic year, please contact the Head of Sixth Form regarding completing a bursary application.

What should I do if I'm not happy with your decision?

Appeals against the decision must be made in writing to the Headteacher within 5 working days of receipt of the bursary notification.

When will I be able to start using funds?

When your application is approved, you can arrange to discuss the use with the Head of Sixth Form. Your Head of Sixth Form will be able to advise you on the process.

How will you pay me?

Bursary payments can be made into your own bank account by a process called BACS transfer. It is essential that you have a bank account in your name as payments can only be made into your own account via a bank transfer. Payments will be made within 10 working days of submission of claims/evidence of spend to the finance office.

It is important that you make sure that your bank or building society is able to accept BACS transfer before you provide your bank account details. Post Office accounts and some Credit Unions do not accept BACS payments.

Bursary money will be issued as discussed with your Head of Sixth Form. You will need to complete the request to spend bursary form and get it authorised prior to making a purchase. You will also need to provide receipts as proof of purchase. Failure to adhere to the correct procedure could lead to purchases not being refunded. The form will be available from your Sixth Form student officer. Wherever possible purchasing should be carried out for the school finance team rather than the student.

How long will I receive payments for?

As long as you are adhering to all the conditions as stated in this document you will continue to be able to use your bursary allocation as agreed.

What happens if my financial or living circumstances change?

If you have a change of personal circumstances such as a change of address or household income, you must let us know immediately in writing.

If you change your bank account details you must also write to us immediately. We will need to check your signature against your original application so we can only accept changes to banking details received by post.

If you leave school before completing your course, your payments will be stopped.
