- Contact home will be made for any future movement down a set





School Attendance

St Martin's School places great importance on excellent attendance.

A large amount of pupils achieve 100% attendance during the course of a school year.

Many exceptional pupils also achieve full attendance in each of the five main school years.

It is clear that pupils cannot afford to miss learning time if they are to be as successful as they want to be.

National statistics show that attendance below 95% can reduce attainment and progress.



The importance of excellent attendance in one school year

Attendance percentage during one whole school year	Days absent in one whole school year	Approximate weeks absent in a school year	Learning time lost in one whole school year
95%	9½ Days	2 Weeks	50 Hours
90%	19 Days	4 Weeks	100 Hours
85%	29 Days	6 Weeks	150 Hours
80%	38 Days	8 Weeks	200 Hours
75 %	48 Days	10 Weeks	250 Hours








Research on reading

- Research indicates that there is a strong correlation between reading proficiency and academic success
- Reading proficiency also influences writing good readers tend to be good writers and vice versa




School Homework Policy

There are no incidences of low-level disruption due to a self-disciplined approach to their studies. They work in a safe manner within the subject. They show an excellent, enthusiastic attitude to their homework.	
God	od	The student shows a consistently positive attitude to their studies. They show respect for others' ideas and views. They bring in the correct equipment and are ready to learn. They respond quickly to instructions and requests. They work in a safe manner within the subject. Homework is completed and to a good standard.	
Requi		The student shows a sporadically positive attitude to their studies. They show an inconsistent respect for others' ideas and views. They may forget to bring in the correct equipment. They are slow to respond to instructions and requests. In practical subjects they need to be reminded about how to work safely. Homework is sometimes of poor quality or deadlines have been missed.	
Inadeq	uate	The student does not engage with the learning in the lesson and therefore persistent disruption to the lesson is common. The student lacks respect for others and shows very little self-discipline. The student shows a negative attitude towards the value of good manners and behaviour. They do not work safely within the subject. Behaviour is a concern. Homework is often incomplete or of consistently poor quality.




