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Attendance Matters

0 days off school in a year 0 lessons missed	100%	Perfect attendance
2 days off school in a year 10 lessons missed	99%	Excellent attendance
5 days off school in a year 25 lessons missed	97%	Good attendance
10 days off school in a year 50 lessons missed	95%	Slightly below average attendance
14 days off school in a year 70 lessons missed	93%	Poor attendance
20 days off school in a year 100 lessons missed	90%	Very poor attendance

90% in a test is a great score, but 90% attendance is very poor.

If your child's attendance is 95% or less it could seriously damage their chances in school or life.

With children missing so much school due to lockdown it is even more important than ever that their attendance is good.

Every day matters. Help your child by making sure they attend school.

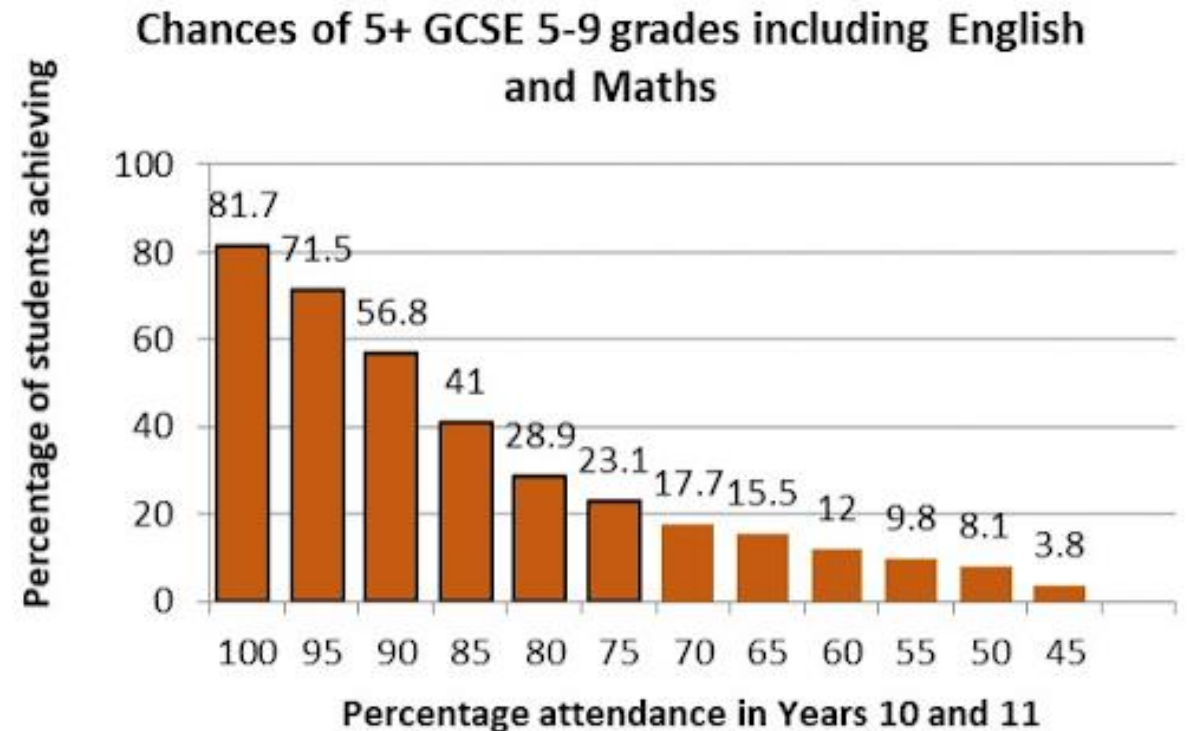

The School Day

Start of School	8:25am
Registration/Form	8:30am
Period One	8:55am
Period Two	10:00am
Morning Break	11:00am
Period Three	11:25am
Period Four	12:30pm
Lunch Break	1:30pm
Period Five	2:15pm
End of School	3:15pm (Years 7 & 8 finish at 3:10pm)

Years 7 and 8 follow the same periods each day but have staggered times at the beginning of break and lunch, the beginning of periods 3 and 5 and the end of the day. Total hours per week for years 7 and 8 is 33.75. Total hours for years 9-13 = 34.2.

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DEAR Time – Drop Everything and Read

Every day for all Year 7-9 pupils for 20 minutes

Reading for Pleasure is surely the entitlement of every child and there is strong evidence linking reading for pleasure with educational outcomes.

We know that academic attainment is of vital importance, but the benefits of reading for pleasure go beyond this and stretch throughout a person's life.

Reading for pleasure has many non-literacy benefits and can increase empathy, improve relationships with others, reduce the symptoms of depression and improve wellbeing throughout life (The Reading Agency 2015).

Every day, students at St Martin's partake in DEAR time (Drop Everything and Read). Time is set aside for students to read a book of their choice from the Accelerated Reader Programme for 20 minutes. Students in key stage 3 also have an accelerated reader lesson once a week.

Parental Engagement



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What are the benefits of parental participation?

John Hattie's seminal 2008 study, *Visible Learning: A Synthesis of Over 800 Meta-Analyses Relating to Achievement* found that **"the effect of parental engagement over a student's school career is equivalent to adding two or three years to that student's education"**.

When parents are involved in their education, children do better on a wide range of measures.

These positive effects include:

- Better behaviour
- More confidence and greater self-esteem
- Higher attendance rates
- A lower risk of exclusion
- More enthusiasm about learning
- Better results

Parental Engagement



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What are the benefits of parental participation?

When schools and parents listen to each other and work together, they have a really positive impact on attainment and student well-being. This is why it is so important that schools work in partnership with their parents, from a child's first days at school right through to when they leave.

At St Martin's we aim to contact parents within 48 hours of the initial communication.
