How to View Behaviour in MCAS

Follow these simple steps to view your child's behaviour information in the MCAS Desktop Site.



1 OPEN BEHAVIOUR

- Log in to MCAS Parent Portal.
- Select **Behaviour** from the left-hand menu.
- You will see a summary of your child's recent behaviour activity.



2 BEHAVIOUR SUMMARY

- View an overview of your child's behaviour points and incidents.
- See positive and negative points totals.
- Charts show behaviour trends over time.



3 FILTER YOUR VIEW

- Use the filters to refine the behaviour information.
- Filter by Date Range, Behaviour Type or Location.
