Sixth Form

The Sixth Form at St Martin's School provides advanced level courses to approximately 400 students between the ages of 16 and 19, in a dedicated Sixth Form centre that provides teaching and study space for them.

There is access to additional teaching space and specialist facilities within the Main School Campus. St Martin's School has a student population of over 1750 with more than 200 members of staff.

The Sixth Form Centre is specifically for the use of our senior students and provides a pleasant and quiet place to work. The Centre allows the students to have their own study areas; library, quiet study area, computer facilities, seminar rooms, toilets and lockable storage. The sixth form common room encompasses an additional study area and benefits from its own "bistro" where students can obtain light meals, snacks and drinks during break times. Wifi access is available for students to use their own portable devices to study. The Sixth Form Office is open during school hours and is accessible directly from the Common Room. In addition, there is a pleasant outdoor area for the use of sixth form students to socialise and take advantage of alfresco dining, weather permitting.





ADMISSIONS TIMETABLE - 2021/22 ACADEMIC YEAR

10 November 2021: Open Evening

<u>January/February 2022:</u> Morning tours from 9.00am-9.45am (by appointment) for small groups of students and parents. Tours will be available starting week commencing Monday 10 January 2022. Places must be booked in advance – please see website for details nearer the time.

1 February 2022: Deadline for application – any applications received after midnight on this date will be placed on our waiting list.

Mid February 2022: 'Next Steps' email sent to all who applied by the deadline

<u>March/April 2022</u>: Advice & Guidance meetings - drop-in sessions held after school 3:30-5:00pm (dates to be advised in February email).

<u>Mid-End April 2022</u>: Emails to applicants requesting confirmation of intention to attend Taster days.

<u>June 2022</u>: Letters sent with conditional offers to applicants and formal invitation to attend the Taster Days in July.

<u>July 2022</u>: Two-day Taster Programme and last chance to change subject choices and submission of reference.

25 August 2022: Results Day (results from students from other schools must be submitted by 1.00pm by email with a scanned copy or a clear photo of the results as an attachment – a hard copy original should be provided if a place is accepted)

<u>25 August onwards</u>: Notification of Place. (This timing is approximate and places may be notified several days after this date).

- Applicants must be able to access email during these days in order to confirm acceptance of their place by a date to be advised or it may be given to others on the waiting list;
- Applicants must be available to either meet in person or over the telephone during the days of 25 – 26 August to discuss any course changes.
- Students from other schools need to attend an induction morning at the start of the new term to meet their tutor and have a photograph taken.

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

The ability to work independently and to take responsibility for one's own learning is highly valued by both future employers and by universities. A 'stretch and challenge' element of the Sixth Form at St Martin's School is available for all students who wish to undertake an individual research project: The Extended Project Qualification [EPQ].

The EPQ is a piece of personal research that requires students to plan, prepare, complete and present a project on a topic or theme of their own choosing but separate to their other A-level examination work. Students will be assigned a staff mentor to guide, support and assess their work, which will be completed between January in Year 12 and December in Year 13. The project is valued as half an A-level but is of A-level standard and will be graded A* - E for a successful project.

Whilst of educational value in itself, the undertaking of the project will give students a unique experience to refer to in job and university applications and to discuss at interview. Many universities are welcoming the development of the EPQ and are adjusting their entry requirements accordingly. The successful completion of the project will help universities and employers differentiate between equally strong applicants and give an advantage in the competition for university places and jobs.

The EPQ is a research project of 5000 words (a student can decide instead to produce an artefact, or organise an event if they wish and while this reduces the word count to a minimum of 1000 words it must also be accompanied by a process log.) Students must present the finding of their work to an audience of their peers. Therefore, the project is an opportunity to undertake a piece of extensive research, demonstrate written skills, planning and organisational skills, self-motivation and presentation skills.

Students will meet with their mentor in Year 12 to allow them time to consider and agree on a suitable topic and for the planning process to begin. The whole process is completed and submitted before any A-level examinations. Many students will choose to do most of the work after the PPEs at the end of Year 12 and will continue through the summer.

Presentations will take place following the completion of the work and results will be published alongside A-level results.

Last year, many students found their offer from university was altered in their favour if they had completed a relevant EPQ.

INDUSTRY AND COMMUNITY LINKS

INSIGHT INTO MANAGEMENT:

The Year 12 'Insight into Management' two-day conference takes place in the summer term. Our excellent team of managers from industry and commerce continue to give the students sound advice, guidance and support.

The Technology faculty has many industrial links in the area. Ford Motor Company Limited has sponsored the Engineering Education Scheme and the Design & Technology faculty works closely with the Anglia Polytechnic University in Chelmsford.

ST MARTIN'S DAY:

Our annual St Martin's Day takes place in November at Brentwood Cathedral, for Year 7 and Year 13 students (parents may attend). After the service, gifts are presented to local senior citizens by a small group of students.

ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The Sixth Form Enrichment programme encourages and supports students in developing their whole school community contribution and personal development, but it is unlikely that a student will gain all their valuable experiences solely through activities completed in school.

Studying at Sixth Form level seeks to prepare young people for the transfer into Higher Education and employment by providing a framework within which they can explore personal interests and aspirations with regard to future career choices. Early in Year 12 an extensive Higher Education programme encourages students to research alternative choices and develop personal aims. Higher Education conferences and other activities, such as university taster courses, inform students and parents of the university application process and support students in successfully securing an appropriate Higher Education placement. Similar support is available for those intending to apply for an apprenticeship and the Sixth Form works closely with their careers advisor to assist students in identifying suitable career opportunities and in making successful applications.

There are many opportunities for students to become active members of both the school and the wider community either through direct involvement or by supporting sixth form activities to raise funds for charities such as LEPRA, Macmillan and UNICEF. Many students give their time supporting the work of the Sixth Form, perhaps through the Student Voice, or assisting younger students by working with form and teaching groups or as student-mentors. In addition, the school is delighted to support student involvement in schemes such as the Duke of Edinburgh Awards Scheme and World Challenge.

Our Pathways Day and Careers Fair Trip days give the students opportunities to consider which route they wish to take post sixth form, either employment, apprenticeship or university. They receive help with their CV and application writing, budgeting, hearing first hand experiences of university life and apprenticeship opportunities from ex-students.

SIXTH FORM DRESS CODE

Sixth Form students are expected to dress smartly, for example as if they were going to work in a formal office. They must adhere to the dress code and therefore are expected to dress appropriately for school and not casually. **This includes examination time.** Students may be asked to go home and change if we feel their clothing is unsuitable <u>regardless of distance or cost of transport.</u>
