The next non-uniform day will be supporting two charities, the Great Ormond Street Hospital fundraising charity and Breast Cancer Now and will take place on Friday 17 May 2019. Both of these charities have been nominated by a present and past student of our school.

GOSH Sight and Sound Centre is set to open in 2020, this will be the UK's first dedicated facility for children with sight and hearing loss. They need to raise £25 million to cover the cost of the centre and as one of our students attends this centre she was keen to help with the fundraising.
