SCHOOL UNIFORM AND APPEARANCE

I would like to remind you that the St Martin's School uniform and rules over appearance continue throughout your child's education period with us. I would be most grateful if students and parents continue to support the school in maintaining the high standards achieved and expected. Clearly, our main task is to prepare students for the time beyond school and most specifically to achieve good examination results and we do not want to be distracted by issues concerning uniform and appearance. A copy of the current school uniform and appearance rules can be found in the students' diaries or on the school's website. Please would you ensure all uniform is named, including bags and PE kits. We are aware that some students have expensive mobile phones and therefore they need to take great care of these and it should be understood that they are brought into school at the student's own risk.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

One of the reasons for our success at St Martin's School at GCSE level is the very high rate of attendance achieved by our students. Missing work from lessons is difficult to make up and understand. Clearly, illness and other events occur to keep students from school, this is unavoidable, but these must be kept to a minimum. **If a student is absent, would parents please telephone Mrs Carter daily before 9.15am and send a letter indicating the reason for your son or daughter's absence on his or her return to school. Non-attendance by students will be followed up daily by truancy call.**

Students should be in school by 8.25am and in form rooms by 8.30am for morning registration and in afternoon lessons by 2.15pm. Any student who arrives after registration has closed must report to the year 8 office to sign in.

Lateness to a registration or lesson will result in a detention. These detentions will take place at break time, lunchtime, or in more persistent cases, after school.

HOMEWORK AND HOMEWORK DIARIES

All students in year 8 have been issued with an individual timetable and homework diary.

It is crucial that all homework is recorded in diaries and that parents check and sign the diary at the end of every week to acknowledge that homework has been completed.

Diaries will be checked by the form tutor and any parental comments written in the diary will be passed onto the relevant member of staff/department. Where a student is absent, he or she should enter this as "ABSENT" in his or her diary. Work missed should be completed when the student returns to school.

The homework timetable is designed to ensure that students are not inundated with work to complete on a particular night. The professional judgement of the teacher will determine if homework is to be set; there will be occasions when homework is due but may not be set. On these occasions, students can take the opportunity to revise or read around the subject.
