The Royal Mail are currently running an exciting art competition and we are joining in! Royal Mail intends to honour the hard work of our coronavirus pandemic heroes in a new set of eight Heroes stamps. The stamps will feature designs created by eight pupils from primary and secondary schools across the UK.

Our students aged 11-14 years are invited to create a design entry for one of the new stamps, celebrating someone who has been their hero through the pandemic. Maybe it's the NHS workers or the Emergency Services; the teachers or the cleaning staff; or maybe the delivery drivers or the supermarket workers. Maybe there is someone close to you who has done something amazing. Whoever you choose, think about how you can honour them in a miniature design.

The final eight winners will receive the prize of having their design made into an official stamp, as well as winning £1000 in high street vouchers. Regional winners will receive £500 in high street vouchers, and Regional Finalists will receive £100 in high street vouchers.
